

## **USS Missouri Memorial Association Recognizes Outstanding Volunteers**

## In 2012 Volunteers Amassed Over 33,700 Hours

**Pearl Harbor** — On a day that celebrated the 69<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the launch of the USS *Missouri* (BB-63) from Brooklyn Navy Yard and the 14<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the ship's opening as a memorial in Pearl Harbor, the USS Missouri Memorial Association (UMMA) recognized all of their outstanding volunteers. In 2012 volunteers at the Battleship Missouri totaled over 5,695 volunteer days for 33,706 hours – an average of 15 volunteers and 92 hours per day.

"The Missouri simply could not be what she is today without the tireless efforts of our volunteers. In just the past year these volunteers have aided us with everything from the restoration of the officers' berthing areas, opening new areas below decks for our new Heart of the Missouri tour, installation of the new teak deck, assisting in our development department and much more," said Michael Carr, President and COO of UMMA. "A special Bravo Zulu goes out to those volunteers and organizations awarded today."

The Battleship Missouri is open daily from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. For those without access into Joint Base Pearl Harbor-Hickam, shuttle buses provide roundtrip transportation from the new Pearl Harbor Visitor Center during operating hours. Standard admission, which includes choice of a guided tour, is \$22 per adult and \$11 per child 4-12. The Battleship Missouri Memorial, located a mere ship's length from the USS Arizona Memorial, completes a historical visitor experience beginning with the "day of infamy" that saw the sinking of USS Arizona in Pearl Harbor and ending with Imperial Japan's unconditional surrender aboard USS Missouri in Tokyo Bay. Following an astounding career that spans five decades and three wars, from World War II to the Korean conflict to the Liberation of Kuwait, the "Mighty Mo" was decommissioned and donated to the USS Missouri Memorial Association, Inc., a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization, which operates the battleship as a historic attraction and memorial. The association oversees her care and preservation with the support of visitors, memberships, grants and the generosity of donors. Named one of Hawai'i's top 10 attractions by Pacific Business News, the Battleship Missouri Memorial has welcomed over 5-million guests and starred in Universal Studios' Battleship in 2012.
